FLOWERS: Annuals & Perennials.

Amaranth – Pigmy Red – *Amaranthus*. An **annual**, with large, dark blue/green foliage & wine red flowers spikes. These easily grown, plants will thrive in poor soils, & any sunny location. Good for cut flowers & filling in spaces in perennial beds. Sow outdoors May or after all danger of frosty nights have passed. Height 60 cm. Space 15 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 200

Aubrieta – Pink. An evergreen, trailing **perennial** with soft gray green leaves. In spring many spikes of, pink to violet flowers appear on stems held above the leaves. Height 10 cm.

Spread 30cm. Zones 5 to 8. Ideal for rock gardens & dry banks. Germination 7 - 21 days. Seeds per pkt.300. **\$3.25**

Baby's Breath – White. *Gypsophila elegans*. A bushy **annual** with small lance-shaped grayish green leaves. Clouds of tiny five petalled pure white flowers in branching heads appear from summer to early fall. Plants prefer full sun & will thrive in any well-drained, soils. Good for late colour in perennial beds. Height 60 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 500. **\$2.85**

Balsam – *Impatiens balsamina*. A fast growing, compact bushy tender **annual**, with lance-shaped pale green leaves. Spurred flowers in shades of deep pink to white appear in summer, followed by a long oval seed pod with dark brown seeds. Prefers a sunny sheltered area. Height 50 cm. Spread 30. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 30. **\$3.25**

Calendula – Bon Bon Mix – *Calendula officinalis*. A fast growing bushy, self-seeding **annual** with aromatic lance shaped, pale green leaves. Double daisy-like flowers, ranging in colours from cream to orange, appear from spring to fall. Edible flowers are used for making tinctures and other herbal remedies. A good companion plant in the vegetable garden, the spicy aroma keeps unfriendly insects away. Height to 40 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt.100+. **2.50**

Campion – Rose – *Lychnis coronaria*. A hardy **deer resistant perennial** with a dense rosette of lance shaped gray leaves. Bright crimson red, five petaled flowers are carried on branched gray stems from summer to fall. Height 60 cm. Spread 45 cm. Zones 4 to 8. Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. **\$2.50**

Campion – White flowers with light pink centers on branched gray stems. **\$2.50**

Cerithe – Blue – *Major purpuracens*. This **annual** has attractive light blue/green rounded, fleshy leaves. Deep blue tubular flowers are carried on the end of each stem followed by two pea shaped blue/black seeds per flower. Plants prefer full sun and well-drained fertile soil & may need staking. Height 30 to 40 cm. Spread 25 cm. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 30. **\$3.00**

Clarkia – Brilliant – A fast growing erect branching annual with oval leaves. Double rosette-like, bright red to light pink flowers are carried along the branching stems, from summer to early fall. Height 60 cm. Spread 30 cm. Plants will often self-seed. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 400+. **\$2.75**

Cleome – Sparkler Mix – *Capparidaceae*. Spider Flower or Rocky Mountain Bee Plant. A hardy self-seeding **annual** with hairy stems & divided leaves. In summer heads of narrow petalled flowers with long protruding stamens appear in shades of pink, mauve, purple & white. Height to 60-cm. Prefers full sun & will tolerate dry conditions. Germination 15 to 30 days Seeds per pkt. 100+. **\$2.75**

Columbine – Mix – *Aquilegia*. An upright, hardy **perennial**. Blue, purple, white, pink & yellow, spurred flowers appear on slender stems in spring & early summer. Plants have basal rosettes of rounded, finely divided, pale green leaves. Height 45 cm. to 1m. Prefers rich soil & semi-shade. Ideal for woodland gardens & transition areas. Zones 4 to 7. Germination 15 to 30 days. Seeds per pkt. 250. **\$2.50**

Columbine – Wild Red, known as “Red Rain Flower” in Haida. In early spring nodding, five petalled flowers with long red spurs & a yellow central tuft of stamens are borne. A self-seeding **perennial**. Seeds per pkt. 150. **\$3.25**

Columbine – Pink Bonnet, double petaled, spurless baby pink flowers on branching stems. A spring flowering **perennial**, good cut flowers to brighten up those rainy days. Seeds per pkt 150. **\$2.50**

Coreopsis – *C.Tinctoria*. A fast growing, erect half-hardy **annual**. Has lance shaped, finely cut, feathery green leaves. Large daisy-like bright yellow flower heads with red centers are carried from summer to late autumn. Plants often re-seed in warmer areas. Good cut flowers. Height 40 to 60 cm. Prefers full sun and well-drained soil. Germination 5 to 10 days. Seeds per pkt. 350+. **\$2.75**

Coreopsis – Mayfield Giant – *C.Grandiflora*. A spreading clump-forming, hardy **perennial**, also grown as an annual. Has lance shaped, serrated, green leaves, with daisy-like bright yellow flower heads from early summer to fall. Prefers full sun & fertile soil. Height 40 to 60 cm. Zones 7 to 10. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 100+. **\$2.75**

Cosmos – Sensations Mix. A bushy erect **annual**, with feathery, light green leaves & daisy like flower heads up to 10 cm. wide. Flowers range in shades of red, pink, mauve, purple and white, from early summer to late fall. Height 60 to 120 cm. Cosmos will thrive in poor dry soils and often re-seed. Good for fall colour in perennial beds. Germination 5 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 200. **\$2.75**

Daisy Shasta – *Chrysanthemum maximum*. An evergreen carpeting **deer resistant perennial**, with dense elongated oval, serrated edged leaves. Large white flower heads with yellow centers are borne on strong single stems throughout the summer. Plants prefer full sun, & will thrive in poor soil. Ideal for troublesome areas in the garden, & wildflower meadows. Height 60 cm. Spread to 30+ cm. Zones 5 to 9. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 500. **\$2.50**

Datura – *Brugmansia*. A fast growing tender **annual** shrub, with oval to elliptic shaped leaves. In summer scented cream, white or pinkish pendant, flared trumpet shaped flowers up to 15 cm. long, open from an inflated calyx. The ornamental seedpods are dark green & prickly in appearance. Start indoors March / April and transplant outside late May to June. Prefers a sheltered sunny location and fertile well-drained soil. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 50. **\$3.25**

Delphinium – Blue. A tall attractive **perennial**, with showy spires, of cup shaped, deep blue flowers & large palmate,

divided leaves. Flower spikes may need support & the non-hybrid “classic blues” sometimes have hooded flowers. Trim stalks after flowering. Prefers full sun & fertile well-drained soil. Height 1 m. Spread 40 cm. Zones 3 to 9. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 250+. **\$3.00**

Dianthus – Pink – *Armeria*. An evergreen tuft forming **perennial** with small narrow lance shaped, dark green leaves. In summer stems of small 5-petaled cerise pink flowers, are carried in small bunches, on stems held above the leaves. Trim back after first bloom to promote a second flowering. Good for rock gardens & sloping banks. Height 30 cm. Spread to 45 cm. Zones 4 to 8. Full sun & well-drained soil Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 600+. **\$2.85**

Electra – Pink – *Seline armeria*. A moderately fast growing, erect branching **annual** with oval gray green leaves. Heads of five petals, bright deep pink flowers are borne from summer to early fall. The perfect vegetable garden companion, these plants take up very little space and can be planted in between vegetables to attract bees and butterflies. Plants tend to self-seed in mild zones. Height to 30 cm. Spread 15 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 600+. **\$2.50**

English Iris – Blue Giant – *Latifolia Bulbous Xiphium*. A **deer resistant perennial**, with lanced shaped, channeled, green leaves scattered up the flower stem. In early summer deep violet flowers appear, with blue to purple standards and a yellow stripe down the center of each dark blue fall. Prefers part shade moist well-drained soils. Zones 4 to 8. Germination to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 35. **\$3.00**

Everlasting Pea – Pinks – *Lathyrus latifolius*. A **perennial** herbaceous tendril climber with winged stems. Leaves have broad stipules and a pair of leaflets. Racemens of scented flowers in various shades pinks to white appear from early to late summer. Perfect for seaside gardens, will tolerate dry soil & salty ocean spray. Height up to 2m. Zones 5 to 9. Germination 7 to 14 days Seeds per pkt. 50. **\$2.50**

Evening Primrose – Yellow – *Oenothera Tetragona*. Full to frost hardy self-seeding **biennial**. Has a large basal rosette of lance shaped green leaves with a white midrib. Dense spikes of fragrant, cup shaped bright yellow flowers appear from middle to late summer, on reddish green stems. Height 1m. Spread 45 cm. Prefers full sun & well-drained soil. Plants may self-seed in warmer zones. Germination 7 to 10 days. Seeds per pkt. 250+. **\$2.50**

Foxglove – *Digitalis*. An upright short-lived **perennial** with a large rosette of oval shaped, rough deep green leaves. Grown as a biennial in colder zones. In summer tall spikes carry downward pointing tubular flowers in shades of pink, mauve, purple & creamy yellow to white. Height 1.5 m. Spread 60 cm. Zones 4 to 8. Plants will thrive in exposed sites. The ideal self-seeding wildflower. Seeds per pkt. 1000. **\$2.50**

Gayfeather – Purple – *Liatris spitaca*. Also known as Blazing star. A clump forming, **perennial**, with basal tufts of grass like green foliage. In mid-summer striking spikes of crowded purple flower heads appear, on thick sturdy stems up

to 60 cm. in height. Sow seeds outdoors April to May and space plants 30 cm. apart. Zones 4 to 9. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. **\$3.00**

Geranium – Pink – *Sanguineum*. A deer resistant, semi-evergreen spreading **perennial**. Late spring cup shaped, deep pink flowers are borne. Trim after flowering to maintain shape & size. Height to 45 cm. Spread 45 to 60 cm. Prefers full sun & well-drained soil. Zones 5 to 9. Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt 200+. **\$3.00**

Grass Ornamental – Blue Fescue. A hardy deer resistant drought tolerant **perennial**. Thin blue, rush-like leaves form a dense silver / blue clump. Zones 4 to 9. Height 30 cm. Spread 40 cm. Plants will thrive in poor soils. Good for rock gardens or borders. Germination to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 250+. **\$3.00**

Grass Ornamental – Bunny Tails *Lagurus ovatus*. A tuft forming self-seeding **annual**, with long narrow flat green leaves. In summer dense elongated, egg shaped, soft panicles of white flowers, with golden stamens are borne. Height 45 cm. Spread 45 cm. Germination to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 250 **\$3.00**

Grass Ornamental – Mix. A surprise selection of hardy ornamental grass varieties in varying sizes & structures. Seeds per pkt.500 **\$3.25**

Hollyhock – Carnival Mix – *Alcea*. A short lived **perennial** or biennial grown for their tall spikes of open trumpet shaped flowers. Ideal back border plant blooming from summer to fall. Leaves are rounded lobed shaped, pale green & rough in texture. Good cut flowers. Height to 2 m. Spread 30 cm. Prefers full sun & well-drained soil. Plants may self-seed in warmer zones. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt.200+. **\$2.50**

Hollyhock – Shades of Pink – Spikes of open trumpet shaped flowers in various shades of pink, flowering all summer long until fall frost. Seeds are best sown in fall or early spring. Seeds per pkt. 200+ **\$2.50**

Iberis – White – *Sempervirens* or Candytuft. An evergreen, spreading **perennial**, with narrow oblong shaped, dark green leaves. Bears dense, rounded heads of white flowers in late spring to early summer. Excellent for rock gardens. Trim after flowering to maintain shape & size. Height to 45 cm. Spread 45 to 60 cm. prefers full sun. Zones 5 to 9. Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 200. **\$3.00**

Lavatera – Mauve – *Cachemiriana* or Tree Mallow. A fast growing, branching, semi-evergreen woody based **perennial** shrub. Pinnacles of shallow trumpet shaped flowers are borne from spring to fall. Leaves are ivy shaped with soft velvet like texture. Height up to 2 m. Spread 1 m. + Prefers full sun & well-drained soil. Zones 6 to 8. Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per packet 30. **\$3.25**

Love Lies Bleeding – *Amaranthus caesatus*. A bushy **annual** with pale green leaves. Panicles of tassel-like deep red

flowers are carried from summer to fall. Attracts pollinators to the garden. Seeds can be sown late to fill in spaces in perennial beds for fall colour. Height to 1 m. Spread 45cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000. **\$2.50**

Lunaria – *Lunaria biennis*. The money plant. An erect branching deer resistant **biennial**, with pointed oval leaves. Heads of scented four petaled purple flowers appear in early spring followed by decorative, silvery flat seedpods. Height 75 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 100. **\$2.50**

Lupine – Mix – *Lupinus leguminosae*. A clump forming, self-seeding **perennial**, with deeply divided green palmate leaves, & spikes of pea-like flowers in early summer. Ideal cut flowers. For best germination results, sow outdoors in fall or pre-chill before spring sowing. Height to 1 m. Spread 45 cm. Prefers full sun. Zones 5 to 8. Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 100. **\$2.75**

Lupine Tree – Yellow – *Lupinus arboreus*. A semi-evergreen multi branching **perennial** shrub with green leaves. In early summer numerous spikes of pea-like clear yellow flowers appear. Height 1 m. + Spread 1m. Seeds are best sown in fall. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 100. **\$3.00**

Monkshood – Newry Blue – *Aconitum napellus*. Also known as aconite or the “poisonous herb”. An upright tuberous **perennial** with divided green leaves. Spikes of striking deep blue hooded flowers appear on 1 to 1.5 meter tall plants in summer. Prefers fertile well-drained soil & part shade. Zones 4 to 9. Germination 14 - 21 days. Seeds per pkt.175. **\$2.75**

Monkshood – Light Blue – Spikes of light blue to white flowers appearing in early summer. Seeds per pkt. 175. **\$2.75**

Morning Glory – Heavenly Blue – *Impomea*. An annual climber with heart shaped green leaves & open funnel shaped deep blue to purple flowers. Height to 3 m. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 20 **\$2.50**

Musk Mallow – Pink – *Malva*. An erect, branching **biennial**, with rounded lobed shaped, leaves. Flared trumpet shaped, light pink flowers are carried along the branching stems from summer to fall. Height 90 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 400+. **\$2.50**

Nasturtium – Jewel Mix – *Tropaeloum*. A fast growing, tender **annual** with rounded, light green leaves. Spurred trumpet shaped flowers in shades of red; orange & yellow are carried from summer until frost. Young leaves & flower heads are edible. Height 30 cm. Trailing spread. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 30 **\$3.00**

Nemophila – Five Spot – *Nemophila maculata*. A quick growing spreading **annual**, with lobed shaped green leaves. Small bowl shaped white flowers, with blue tipped petals are carried in summer. Height 15 cm. Spread 30 cm. Good for rock gardens and edging beds. Full sun or part shade and fertile well-drained soil.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 100. **\$2.85**

Nicotiana – Dwarf Mix – *N. solanaceae*. A fairly slow growing, tender **annual**. Trumpet shaped flowers appear, in a wide range of colours throughout summer. Flowers are highly scented especially at night. Ideal for containers & window boxes. Height 40 to 80 cm. Spread 30 cm. Prefers full sun & well-drained soil.

Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 600+. **\$2.50**

Nicotiana – White – *N. sylvestris*. A sturdy upright, branching **annual** or perennial in zones 8 to 10. Large long, oval shaped, rough green leaves, very tropical in appearance on 1 to 1.5 m. tall plants. Stem bears large pinnacles of fragrant, pendant white flowers. Space 50 cm. apart. Seeds per pkt. 1000. **\$2.85**

Nigella – Persian Jewels – *Nigella Damascena* or Love in a Mist. A fast growing upright **annual**, with feathery, green leaves. Spurred, many petaled, blue or white flowers appear in summer, followed by inflated brown & green seedpods. Prefers fertile well-drained soil & full to partial sun. Height to 40 cm. Spread 20 cm.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 250+. **\$2.50**

Poppy – Oriental Mix – *Papaver Orientalis*. A **deer resistant**, rosetted **perennial** with broad lance shaped, toothed or cut, rough green leaves. Single bright vermilion, orange, salmon, pink, mauve & white flowers, with dark blotches at the base of the petals, are borne in early summer. Height 80 cm. Spread 30 cm. Zones 4 to 9.

Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000 **\$3.00**

Poppy – P. Orientalis– Peach – Large pale orange flowers with deep brown centers. Seeds per pkt. 1000. **\$2.75**

Poppy – P. Orientalis– Red – Large deep red blossoms, with black centers on strong single stems. Seeds per pkt. 1000. **\$2.75**

Poppy – Coloured Mix – *Papaver*. Fast growing upright self-seeding **annual** with oblong, lobed shaped, light grayish green leaves. Flowers are single & double in shades of red, pink, purple or white, produced throughout the summer. Good for wildflower areas. Height 30 to 60 cm. Spread 30 cm. Prefers full sun & well drained soil.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000+. **\$2.75**

Poppy – California – *Eschscholzia californica*. A **deer resistant annual** with feathery blue-green leaves & four petaled cup shaped vivid orange flowers, early summer to fall. Height 30 cm. Spread 15 cm. Ideal for dry banks, rock gardens and wildflower areas. Plants will often self-seed. Good for wildflower meadows.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 500+. **\$2.75**

Poppy – California – Purple Gleam. A **deer resistant annual**, with cup shaped, dark pink to purple flowers appearing until fall. Seeds per pkt. 500+. **\$2.75**

Poppy – Peony Pink – *P. somniferum*. Indescribably elegant, the blooms of this poppy really do look like a peony. Fast

growing, erect, self-seeding **annual**, with lobed shaped pale grayish green leaves & multi-petaled, pink flowers. Height to 85 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000+. **\$2.50**

Poppy – Welsh – Yellow – *Meconopsis cambrica*. Bright lemon yellow poppies appear, above fresh green, oval toothed, hairy foliage in late spring to early summer. This clump forming **deer resistant perennial** is usually treated as an annual. Ideal for rock gardens & wildflower areas, plants often re-seed. Height 35 cm. Spread 30 cm.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000+. **\$2.50**

Rudbeckia – Green Eyes – *Rudbeckia hirta*. A hardy **perennial** with yellow flower heads & green centers blooms throughout late summer and fall. Has narrow lance shaped green leaves. Flower heads are excellent for cutting, long lasting. Height to 80 cm. Spread 30 cm. Thrives in full sun or part shade & well-drained soil. Zones 6 to 8.

Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 200+. **\$3.00**

Snapdragon – Coloured Mix – *Antirrhinum*. A semi-evergreen, half-hardy, sub-shrub usually grown as an **annual**. Plants will often over-winter & re-seed in mild areas. Flowers appear from spring to late fall, producing spikes of tubular, trumpet shaped, two-lipped flowers, in a very wide range of colours. Height to 45 cm. Spread 20 to 30 cm.

Germination 7 to 10 days. Seeds per pkt. 1000+. **\$2.50**

Snow in Summer – White – *Cerastium tomentosum*. A very vigorous, ground cover **deer resistant perennial**, with tiny gray leaves. In late spring to summer star shaped white five petals flowers, appear on stems above the foliage. The ideal plant for rock gardens, sloping banks and hanging over low walls. Plants will tolerate dry areas. Height 8 cm. Spread to 40 cm+. Zones 4 to 8.

Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 500+. **\$2.85**

Stocks – Coloured Mix – *Mathiolla*. A fast growing, erect bushy, biennial grown as an **annual**, with lance shaped, grayish green leaves. Spikes of highly scented flowers in a wide range of colours appear from summer to fall, attracting hummingbirds & butterflies to the garden. Good cut flowers. Height to 45 cm. Spread 30 cm.

Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 300+. **\$2.85**

Summer Hyacinth – White – *Galtonia Candicans*. Late summer or early fall flowering **perennial** bulb, with wide, strap shaped, fleshy, basal green leaves. The leafless stem has a spike of up to 30 pendant short tube shaped, white flowers. Plants grown from seeds will flower the following year. Height to 1 meter. Spread 20 cm. Zones 7 to 9.

Germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 130. **\$3.00**

Sunflower Mix – *Helianthus*. An appealing combination, of **annual** sunflower varieties, in shades of reds oranges & yellows. Tall, short & intermediate heights, just right for any spot in the garden. Excellent cut flowers. Edible seeds are Mother Nature's bird feeders.

Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 50. **\$3.00**

Sunflower – Red Small – *Helianthus*. Fast growing, erect branching intermediate **annual** with oval serrated leaves. Large daisy like flower heads, in shades of red, sometimes mottled with orange, appear in summer. Sunflowers prefer full sun & fertile well-drained soil and they all bear edible seeds. Height to 1.5 m. Spread to 40 cm. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 50. **\$2.50**

Sunflower – Yellow Giant – *H. annuus giganteus*. This **annual** has extremely large, bright yellow flower heads up to 30 cm. in diameter, with brown to deep purple centers. The flower heads mature into numerous white seedpods with edible seeds, the all round favorite and delicious producer of sunflower seeds. Plants will grow up to 2 meters in height. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 50. **\$2.50**

Sweet Peas – Explorer Mix – *Leguminosae Lathyrus*. An **annual** with large fragrant blossoms, in a wide range of colours. Sow outdoors early spring or as soon as the ground can be worked. Good cut flowers. Height climbing to 1 m. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per packet 50. **\$2.75**

Sweet William – *Dianthus Barbutus*. An upright bushy **perennial** with lance shaped pale green leaves. In early summer dense heads of highly scented, flat flowers appear, in shades of pinks, red & white. Full sun or part shade. Height 35 cm. Spread 30 cm. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 100. **\$2.50**

Telekia – *Bupthalam speciosum*. An upright spreading **deer resistant perennial**, with large heart shaped leaves. In summer branched stems, bear large daisy-like, rich gold flowers. Height 1 to 2 m. Spread 1 m. Zone 5 to 9. Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 500+. **\$2.75**

Thrift Sea – Pink – *Armeria*. A clump forming, **deer resistant, perennial**, with evergreen grass like foliage. VEGETABLES :

Amaranth – Mix - These plants are regal in the garden up to 1 m. in height, with catkin like plumes in shades of red, gold, green & purple. The seeds/grains can be added to cereals, baked goods & the young leaves steamed or added to salads. Sow outdoors May, in a warm sunny location & thin plants to 15 cm. apart. Harvest grain after 95 days. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 400+. **\$3.00**

Most varieties of dry beans will germinate in 7 to 14 days, be ready for harvest in approx. 100 days. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per packet 50 except as noted.

Black Coco – *Bush*: Also known as Black Turtle, plump shiny jet-black oval to round shaped beans. **\$2.50**

Broad Bean – Windsor. Height 1m. Plump light green pods with pale green/white seeds. Plant outdoors Feb. to April or September in the Pacific Northwest & mulch plants for over-winter protection. Seeds per pkt. 30 **\$2.85**

Broad Bean – Purple. Deep purple coloured beans, similar in Size & taste to the Windsor Broad Bean. Seeds per pkt. **\$2.85**

Leeks – Overwinter – Sow outdoors June/July & harvest early spring. Protective mulch needed for during the colder winter months. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt.250. **\$3.00**

LETTUCES & SALAD GREENS:: Best grown in the cool moist days of spring & fall. Nitrogen rich soil promotes abundant lush leafy growth. Successive plantings every 2 to 3 weeks provides tender salad greens throughout the growing season. Sow as soon as the ground can be worked or earlier under cover. Germination for all lettuces & most salad greens, approx. 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt for all lettuces 1000.

Lettuce – Mix – A complementary collection of different types, colours, textures & tastes. Best planted for “cut-&-come again” baby greens, ready for harvest after 30 days. Plants can be spaced 25 to 30 cm, apart for individual heads. **\$3.00**

Lettuce – Black Seeded Simpson – Loose-leaf variety with large curled, light green leaves. Slow to bolt and plants will tolerate the cool days of fall. **\$2.50**

Lettuce – Butterhead – Thick crispy, light green leaves, surrounding a pale green head. Heavy watering helps prevent the bitter taste in lettuces. **\$2.50**

Lettuce – Green Ice – A “loose leaf” variety, bright green ruffled leaves with curled outer edges and white/green ribs.

Slow to bolt & can be grown in part shade, during the hottest summer months. **\$2.50**

Lettuce – Red Flame – A vigorous “loose leaf” variety, rich burgundy frilled leaves. Sow every 2 to 3 weeks for a continuous supply of fresh lettuce. **\$2.50**

Arugula – Salad Green – A Mediterranean “spinach-like” salad green, with dark green lobed leaves and a nutty/peppery flavour. Cold hardy.
Germination 7 to 10 days. Seeds per pkt. 450+. **\$2.75**

Corn Salad – Salad Green – Known as “Lamb’s lettuce”. A small rosette of tender dark green leaves. Very cold hardy, best planted in fall or very early spring.
Germination 7 to 10 days. Seeds per pkt.325+. **\$2.50**

Mustard – Mix – A zesty combination of 3 mustard greens. **Giant Red**, with large deep burgundy leaves and pale green ribs. **Southern Giant Curled**, striking light green leaves with tightly curled edges. **Indian Mustard**, smaller pale green oval shaped leaves, with red veins & edges. Harvest leaves as needed after 30 days.
Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 300+. **\$3.00**

Mustard Spinach – A very cold hardy salad green. Prefers the cool spring & fall days for growing or plants will go to flower. Harvest leaves as needed.
Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 200. **\$3.00**

Pepper Cress – Salad Green. Leaves are pale green, lobed shaped & frilly with a slight nutty peppery taste. Best grown in spring & early fall. A cold hardy, tasty salad green.

Pac Choi – An oriental green, great stir fried or added to salads. A rosette of glossy green leaves carried on pale white/green thick juicy stalks. Plants prefer cool weather & will bolt easily. Edible flowers. Space 15 to 20 cm. apart.

Sorrel – French – A **perennial salad green**, one of the first to appear in the garden. Pale green, tangy 15 cm. long leaves. High in vitamin C. Zones 4 to 8. Height 30 cm. Spread to 40 cm.+ Germination 7 to 21 days. Seeds per pkt. 500. **\$2.75**

Onions are heavy feeders. They require nutrient rich soil, heavy watering and full sun. Start indoors March/April or direct sow after last frost. Space plants 15 to 20 cm, apart. Protective mulch prevents water loss during summer. Feed plants with helpings of manure tea for extra large onions. Harvest most varieties after 180 days or when tops fall over. Hang onions to dry, in an area without direct sunlight, & remove debris before storage.
Germination for most onion varieties 7 to 14 days.

Egyptian Walking – A perennial green onion, providing early greens. In summer top sets of little onions are borne, they mature, fall over, develop roots and grow to expand the patch. Zones 4 to 9. Sets per packet 40. Best planted in fall or early spring. **\$3.00**

Onion – Mix – A mix of annual onions. **\$3.00**

Red Baron – Deep red, round globes with pink flesh, & red stems. Has a mild onion. Seeds per pkt 350. **\$3.00**

Welsh Green Spring – A perennial producing early greens to 40 cm. tall. Zone 4 to 9. Seeds per pkt. 175 **\$3.25**

White Lisbon – Small onions, used for pickling & will mature to 4 cm in diameter. Seeds per pkt. 350. **\$2.75**

Yellow – Firm, oval to round globes with tan coloured skins. The best storage onion. Seeds per pkt. 350. **\$2.75**

Parsnip – Smooth white skin & tender sweet roots, up to 25 cm. long with white interiors. Sow outdoors May/June & thin plants 6 to 9 cm. apart, leaving the strongest to mature. Flavour is best after first fall frost. Harvest after 110 days. Keep seeds moist during germination 14 to 21 days. Seeds per packet 150. **\$2.75**

PEAS: Best grown during the cool moist days of spring, sow outdoors as soon as the soil can be worked & harvest most varieties after approx. 100 days. Ideal for small spaces, sow seeds in rows 3cm. apart & use trellises at least 1.5m. in height. Sowings every 2 weeks throughout spring & early summer allows extended harvests, & mid. July to Aug. for a fall crop. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per packet for all varieties 80.

Snow Peas – Tender, flat light green pods, best harvested when the outline peas is visible in the edible pod. **\$3.00**

Soup Pea/Dried – Triple sets of tendrils allow plants to cling to each other, plant in rows of 4+, very little or no staking needed. Allow pods to dry on their plants & harvest a bounty of smooth pale green dried peas. **\$3.00**

Sugar Snap – The sweetest, string-less snap pea. White flowers followed by thick juicy walled edible pods. **\$3.00**

Telephone Shelling – Huge plump round pods holding 8 to 11 peas each, easy to harvest & shell. Ideal for freezing.

PEPPERS :: Heat loving plants, ideal for greenhouses or a

warm sunny location in the garden. Peppers like the soil around their roots to be warm but not dry. Start indoors March / April in a warm room & keep temperature {27deg.C. +} constant, during germination 7 to 14 days. Transplant outdoors after the soil has warmed up June / July To “harden plants off”, place in a shady spot & return indoors at night, for at least 4 to 6 days & transplant on a shady day if possible. Harvest most varieties after 80 days, & pick regularly to promote flowering. Water heavily, during mid-summer. Use gloves or **wash hands after handling hot peppers & seeds.** Seeds per pkt. 45 for all peppers.

Cayenne - HOT – Pencil shaped, slender green 10 to 12 cm. long fruits, turning bright red when mature. **\$3.00**

Green Bell – Deep green, thick walled, blocky fruits, pick before peppers turn red to keep plants flowering. **\$3.00**

Heatwave – HOT – One of the hottest early peppers, green, orange & maturing to red 6 to 8 cm. long. **\$3.00**

up **Jalapeno – HOT** – Thick walled, round 7 to 7 cm. long fruits, hottest when sun ripened to a deep red. **\$3.00**

up **Portugal – HOT** – Mild hot 15 to 18 cm. long, tapered bullhorn shaped, red peppers. Good for drying. **\$3.00**

Prairie Fire – HOT – Extremely hot little, pale yellow/white, orange & maturing to red, 2/3 cm. long. **\$3.00**

Pumpkin – Cinderella – An old French heirloom also known as *Rouge vif d'Etampes*. A reddish/deep orange flattened pumpkin weighing up to 20 lbs. Sow outdoors late May to June. 3 to 4 plants per mound and allow adequate space for vines to run freely. Plants prefer full sun, nutrient rich soil & heavy watering. Harvest after 110 days. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. 12. **\$3.25**

Pumpkin – Howden – Large plump tall rounded pumpkins. Bright reddish / orange outer skin. The best pumpkin for carving. Seeds per pkt. 12. **\$2.75**

Squash – Spaghetti – Traveling vines producing very pale yellow to tan coloured oval shaped fruits Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per packet 12 **\$3.00**

RADISH :: A cool weather root crop, best grown in spring and fall. Sow outdoors in early spring or as soon as the ground can be worked. Sow Aug. to Sept. for fall harvests. Thin plants 3 to 4 cm. apart and harvest after 35 to 40 days. Germination 7 to 14 days. Seeds per pkt. all radishes 200

Black Spanish – Large, round roots to 8 cm. in diameter, with black rough, outer skins & white interiors. **\$3.00**

Cherry Bell – Red round radishes, white interiors. **\$2.75**

Easter Egg – Round roots with white interiors, and outer skin in shades of purple, red, pink & white. **\$2.75**
